OLD BUSINESS:

The Board continues to discuss the subject of the proposed OSHA changes to NSPA guidelines, which will bring enormous burdens to poorly funded and volunteer fire departments in twenty-eight OSHA states, of which New York is one. For example, per the new guidelines, there is not a single firefighter in the Pines Department would qualify as chief, first assistant or second assistant. No decisions were made.

The Board expressed continued concern regarding the expansion of the Mobility Cart storage sheds to the East of the Police Garage. Access to the existing fire hydrant and road clearance for fire trucks.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Board discussed the possible addition of Blue Point Beach to our Fire Protection District. It was decided that we will do further research and discuss again.
