Meeting called to order by Comm. Barry at 3:15 PM.

MOTION: Comm. Corradino moved to accept the draft August 2020 minutes. Comm. Boss seconded the motion; all were in favor, and the motion passed.

MOTION: Comm. Corradino moved to accept the Treasurer's reports. Comm. Teague seconded the motion; all were in favor, and the motion passed.

Forrett noted that we have used all of our support time for the District web site. He requested the District spend another \$470 to purchase a 500-minute support package from Kage Solutions.

MOTION: After a very brief discussion, Comm. Coluccio moved to allocate up to \$470 to purchase a 500-minute support package from Kage Solutions. Comm. Corradino seconded the motion; all were in favor, and the motion passed.

MOTION: After a discussion about online training options offered by the Office of the State Comptroller regarding Government GAAP and fire district accounting, Comm. Corradino moved to spend up to \$340 to register Comm.

Coluccio and Secretary/Treasurer Forrett for two three-day online courses. Comm. Boss seconded the motion; all were in favor, and the motion passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Apparatus/Equipment/Radios - Commissioner Teague

Comm. Teague noted that all equipment is running well, and general maintenance continues.

We have been having a problem with the battery in 9A; District Mechanic Furchert put a new battery in the truck today.

Comm. Teague also noted we need to start to prepare to test the 7,000-plus feet of hose on our fleet of vehicles. We need to get ballpark figures for various options: in-house testing, bringing the vehicles over to the mainland, etc. He also noted that the Water Island hoses are being tested *in situ* in Water Island. Comm. Barry noted that both Tony's Barge and Coastline Freight will charge \$900 each way for the large pumpers. District Mechanic Furchert said that the beach is in such good condition that it would be easy for him to drive the trucks to the mainland.

As a final note, Comm. Teague pointed out that, following Sandy and other storms, the bay-side stairs or ramps on the cross-walks have been eliminated by the Town of Brookhaven. In many cases, there is a six-foot-plus distance between the end of the walk and the Bay, and this makes for a very difficult situation for bringing in a water pump

from the Bay, getting to the Bay side of a house on fire, or pulling people in distress out of the Bay. Comm. Boss suggested the Board, in conjunction with bayside homeowners, write to the Brookhaven Highway Department requesting the stairs be rebuilt. Comms. Corradino and Barry agreed to do a survey of the state of the bayside cross-walks. Comm. Barry will then draft a letter to the Brookhaven Highway Department.

Budgets - Commissioner Coluccio

Comm. Coluccio presented a draft of the preliminary 2021 budget. She reminded the Board that state and local tax revenues are significantly lower this year because of the Covid-19 pandemic, meaning that we need to prepare for a very lean year. There was significant discussion of the various budget lines, particularly insurance, equipment maintenance, and personnel expenses.

Comm. Coluccio acknowledged the equipment request budget from Chief Geiman, including the turn-out gear and uniforms for the new Department members. Chief Geiman noted that two or three members also need new turn-out boots.

The discussion led to several changes that will be reflected in the budget proposal Comm. Coluccio will present in the October meeting.

Records - Commissioners Coluccio, Corradino

Comms. Corradino and Barry have been busy cleaning up old records in the Commissioners' office. They have cleared an enormous amount of space. Along the way, they discovered many interesting historical documents, and they are putting together a Fire Department archive.

Membership – Commissioner Barry

Comm. Barry noted we need to make a decision about what the District is doing about LOSAP points. With the advent of the Covid pandemic and the State-imposed shut-down, the State indicated Districts can give five points to Department members for every month of service during the pandemic. He will consult with William Glass whether the 10% of alarms requirement still applies during the pandemic, and then the Board will make a decision about the point allocation.

Comm. Barry noted that the 2021 physicals that were scheduled for May 8, 2021 need to be rescheduled because of a conflict on the part of NDI.

Comm. Barry has been dealing with Mark Basta's Worker's Comp. claim.

He also reminded the Board that the annual Commissioner election takes place on Tuesday, September 15. Kris Grae, Ken Pollard and David Seeds have volunteered to be election inspectors.

Insurance – Commissioner Barry

Comm. Barry noted that every year, he receives an insurance survey of the property and vehicles insured. He noted that this year's document included a vehicle that was disposed of in 2014, even though that vehicle was not included in the document from the last several years. It turns out the insurance carrier never removed the vehicle from the insurance coverage. We will be reimbursed for these charges, some \$700.

Public Relations/LOSAP/Alarms/ ISO - Commissioner Boss

Comm. Boss is preparing a letter for the upcoming FIPPOA meeting. Comm. Barry noted that the Fire District line in his tax bill decreased by 8.8%, and he suggested that be mentioned in Comm. Boss' letter.

Chief Geiman also suggested the FIPPOA membership be reminded that their fire insurance should specify the Fire Island Pines Fire District so that the Foreign Fire Insurance 2% comes to the FIP Fire Department, not other departments.

Also to be included in the letter: mentions of voter registration and access, the TNT rescue drill, and the purchase of the new truck.

Comm. Boss remarked that the new Shoulder Blend that has been placed on the service route of the Boulevard has led to water not draining properly. Comm. Barry suggested Comm. Boss draft a letter to be sent to the FIPPOA Community Manager explaining that this is very unhelpful for the passage of vehicles, and it will be even more so during the winter when the undrained water freezes.

Grounds - Commissioner Corradino

Comm. Corradino was pleased to report that a Pines resident has offered \$1,000 to purchase and remove the wood-burning stove from 32 Lone Hill Walk. Comm. Barry remarked that several people in the community who had expressed an interest in the stove, but this was the only offer communicated to the Board in writing. Comm. Boss noted that this was a very satisfactory price for this equipment.

MOTION: After discussion, Comm. Boss moved to accept this offer for the Annex stove. Comm. Teague seconded the motion; all were in favor, and the motion passed.

The insulation for the Old Firehouse will be installed on Saturday, September 19. Comm. Corradino will consult with Comms. Boss and Teague about options and expected pricing for the heating unit to be installed.

Comm. Corradino noted that the three trees in front of the Annex are now in the correct place.

The door to the Chief's office cracked in two along the hinge side. The District Mechanics were able to repair and re-hinge the door. Comm. Corradino noted that the door will need to be replaced sometime soon.

Finally, Comm. Corradino noted there are full glass, sliding doors leading outside from the two bathrooms in the Annex. He suggested they be removed, and windows and walls be put in their place, perhaps to be included in the 2021 building maintenance plans.
